DEC.NAT 2011 - Statistics

The database contains some 21,250 references to national decisions concerning Community law from 1959 up to the present day.

It was recently brought up to date on 19th July 2011.

Translation into English of the 2010 data began end of the year 2010. The first translations were received on 31 January 2011 and all data were incorporated into the database during the course of March. Data for the second half of 2010 are currently being translated.

A - Project for the connection between DEC.NAT's references and national databases

In Lisbon in 2008, the General Secretariat demonstrated the link system set up between the database and the full-text rulings of the Constitutional Court of Belgium.

Two pilot projects had been set up with the Netherlands and Portugal with a view to achieving the same results for the courts of those two Member States.

The Council of State of the Netherlands sent its updated links for the period 2000-2004 at the end of January and those for the period 2008-2010 in early February, thus completing the data already sent for the period 2004-2008. The General Secretariat stated that this information would be incorporated in March so that the full texts of the relevant Dutch decisions could also be accessed from Dec.Nat.

The links to the website <http://www.rechtspraak.nl> are now functional for all the decisions contained in Dec.Nat., providing they are available on the Dutch national website, for the period 2000-2010. The Council of State of the Netherlands will continue to provide the requisite information as and when Dec.Nat. is updated.

Portugal, which hosted the Support Committee meeting in 2008, had invited to the event the various parties involved in the publication of national case law on the internet, including the Ministry of Justice, and the contacts made should mean that links to the full-text version of their rulings would be available soon. The Secretariat General will renew contact on this with Portugal who has not so far indicated how links can be made.

If the national website coordinators so wish, pilot projects could also be launched to create a mirror link, i.e. from the national site to the Dec.Nat. database.

Other member courts could be contacted during the course of 2011 so as to gradually extend the system to include as many national courts as possible.

Spain's involvement in the pilot project

In line with Spain's presidency of ACA Europe, Mr Joaquín Silguero Estagnan, head of Spain's Judicial Documentation Centre (CENDOJ), has been contacted.

B - Point of situation referring to the negotiations with ECJ and the Publication's Office for the access to DEC.NAT through EUR-Lex

The Court of Justice, working with ACA-Europe, has finalised a weekly updating system for data being sent to the Office. Each week, the Court will place Dec.Nat data that has been added or modified on the servers of ACA-Europe, and these data are automatically incorporated into the database the next day.

A web service was developed in late 2008 to allow the Publications Office to connect to the servers of ACA-Europe at any time to extract data that have been modified or added since a certain date.

Following a change of technology requested by the Office, an additional development comprising a CGI application and an RSS feed was completed in the first months of 2009. This gives the Office extensive access to Dec.Nat data provided by the Court and updated each week, and to the English translations produced by ACA-Europe.

The Office recently detected a problem relating to some accented letters in Dec.Nat. that are not being formatted properly. The General Secretariat has looked into the issue and has made the corrections needed to resolve the problem.

The system is operational and the ACA-Europe provides regular maintenance as required by the Court and the Office.

The Office launched sector 8 of EUR-Lex on Tuesday September 6 and as such DEC.NAT database national rulings are now available via the National Case Law section of EUR-Lex:

As at 7 September 2011, JuriFast contained 1.119 national decisions (plus subsequent decisions relating to preliminary questions) communicated by 25 member courts and 1 observer.

Two courts had not yet submitted any data: the two courts of the Member States which joined the European Union in 2007, the Supreme Administrative Court of Bulgaria and the High Court of Cassation and Justice of Romania.

As regards the type of decisions, around 74 % are decisions without preliminary reference and 26 % relate to preliminary questions.

A - Elaboration of procedural rules concerning the introduction of Court's decisions and summary's presentation

The rules detailed below have been adopted to guarantee the quality of the summaries provided by member courts. They have been sent to all contact people on numerous occasions but are still not being uniformly applied by all member courts.

Owing to the growing number of decisions added to JuriFast, failure by member courts to adhere to the maximum summary length is increasingly posing significant problems. Not only is the General Secretariat required to arrange translation of these summaries from English into French and vice-versa, but some member courts are also using the opportunity to have their summaries translated from their native language into French or English. This generates considerable translation costs.

If after a further reminder, these rules are not respected, the General Secretariat will in this case only translate the subject of the decision. Any other suggestion on this topic from the members of the Support Committee is welcome.

RECOMMENDATIONS ON SUMMARIES

1. FORMAT

Summaries must be presented in a **uniform** way for ease of reading.

1.1. The following layout must be used:

[Member State] – [Court] – [Decision reference] – [Date of decision]

[Subject (must be the same as in the 'subject' field)]

Optional: [*identification of parties*]

[Text of the summary]

1.2. Summaries should be written in a commonly-used **font**, preferably Times New Roman.

1.3. Documents should be submitted in **PDF format**, ensuring that the document protection options allow copies to be made and content to be extracted¹. Documents in *Word* format cannot be read by all users, whereas *PDF* documents can be read using *Acrobat Reader*, which can be downloaded free of charge. However, to facilitate the translation process, a *Word* version of the document should also be sent to the following address: robert.quintin@aca-europe.eu .

2. CONTENT

The summary's content should take account of its **target readers**. The following guidelines should therefore be followed:

2.1. Keep the texts **as short as possible**.

- Put yourself in your reader's place as you write: readers will ignore information if a text is too long.
- Do not report on previous decisions by appeal or other courts unless this is absolutely necessary for understanding the case: the point of interest is the decision of last instance, not the entire national appeal route.
- Do not report on aspects of the decision that have very little or no connection with European law, whether or not they were important for the case.
- Do not report on issues raised legitimately by the court as part of the case but which have no educational value for the site's visitors, e.g. cases in which a preliminary question can or must be put forward.

Existing JuriFast summaries show that it is perfectly possible to keep to a limit of **300 words**², unless there are exceptional circumstances. Indeed, some summaries provide enough information in 100 or so words.

2.2. Ensure that you use **simple language**.

Only 22% of the European Union's inhabitants are native speakers of English or French. In other words, the summaries are written in languages that most readers only know as a second language.

You should therefore try to use **everyday language** and **short sentences**, even if this means departing from the wording used by the court in question.

For similar reasons, you should also **avoid abbreviations** unless they are explained in the summary itself. Abbreviations commonly used in the European Union (such as ECJ and EU) are an exception to this rule.

In 2008 in Lisbon, the importance of the selections made by the research and documentation departments of each member court was highlighted. Although the number of rulings forwarded has increased substantially over the years, it is necessary to remind those less-active member courts just how crucial their involvement was and a fresh circular will be sent out to this end to the Presidents of the courts concerned.

Other suggestions from members of the Support Committee on how to encourage less active correspondents are welcome.


C – JuriFast v2

Recent meetings of the Database Support Committee have highlighted the need to expand the functionalities of JuriFast. A word search function when consulting the summaries and a basic classification system for decisions similar to the one used by the Court of Justice for Dec.Nat. are regarded as important elements to be developed within JuriFast. Moreover, in order to enable those wishing to keep up-to-date with new decisions uploaded onto the system to do so without being inundated with unwanted emails, it was felt that adding an RSS feed would help to modernise the system.

In order to make these important changes, the technology currently used for JuriFast would have to be abandoned and the entire system redesigned.

The General Secretariat is currently steering work on this new development. An initial test version was finalised and submitted to JuriFast data managers at the end of March. The problems detected and the comments made have been examined and a new version was ready at the beginning of July.

The General Secretariat hopes to be able to move over to the new system by end-2011.

Suggestion for improvement

The Council of State of the Netherlands submitted a question concerning the Charter of Fundamental Rights of the European Union but received no response. It is true that the number of responses given to questions submitted varies considerably: in some cases quite a lot of responses will be received but, unfortunately, in others none at all. To address this problem, the Council of State of the Netherlands has suggested that in addition to different individual participants in the Forum each institution also appoint an officer tasked specifically with following up whether representatives from his/her court have responded to questions submitted and, where they have not, ensuring that one or other of them does so.

The Board approved the proposal.

As noted in Lisbon and Istanbul, more active participation of committee members on the forum could also help to improve the tool. One possibility could be for members to systematically disseminate any useful information that they come across and to contribute to open subjects to encourage other participants to respond.

Suggestions from the members of the Support Committee

Reflets review

The *Reflets* review gives an overview of recent case law in the various EU Member States. It is produced by the Documentation Service of the Court of Justice.

At a meeting on 8 November 2007 with representatives from the Office and the Court's Documentation Service, the following collaboration was agreed:

- The Court of Justice drafts the text of *Reflets* in French, selecting from among the national decisions found mainly in Jurifast;
- The Association translates the text into English;
- The Office publishes and sells the journal, although it is free for Association members.

This project has not yet come into being. At the Board meeting in Brussels on 29 November 2009, the ECJ representative Mr Timmermans suggested initially proceeding on the basis of a limited collaboration between the ECJ and ACA-Europe, the latter having been charged with translating *Reflets* into English and publishing it on the website.

Issues 1, 2 and 3 of the 2010 *Reflets* review have been translated and have been uploaded onto the Association's website.

Updating the Tour of Europe section of the website

The seminar of Istanbul on 1st October 2009, dedicated to the « up-to-date » of the tour of Europe, allowed to collect the most recent informations about different themes tackled in the section « Tour of Europe » of the website of ACA-Europe.

The General Secretariat has incorporated the new answers to the questionnaire in the language chosen by the member courts during the first half of 2010.

The General Secretariat was also responsible for translating the answers into English or French as appropriate. The Tour of Europe is now fully updated in both English and French.

Updating the section “Guide to preliminary ruling proceedings before the Court of Justice EC”

The Association's website provides access, via the “Case Law” section, to the “Guide to preliminary ruling proceedings before the Court of Justice EC”. This guide is a formatted version of the Guide of the same name compiled by the Dutch Euro Group, which is an informal working group of the Judicial Association of the Netherlands (Association of Judges and Public Prosecutors).

This section was last updated on 1 March 2004.

At the request of ACA-Europe, the Euro Group, one of whose members is Ms. Hanna Sevenster, a member of the Dutch Council of State, has provided an updated version of the Guide.

The version of the Guide currently available on the website (in French and in English) now incorporates the modifications made to the new Guide, which was written in Dutch.

Actions to publicise the website

ACA-Europe brochure

To provide greater visibility for ACA-Europe, particularly given the Association's new abbreviation, the General Secretariat has drafted an attractive but succinct brochure containing information about the Association, its members and activities; special emphasis has been placed on the wealth of information and opportunities available on the ACA-Europe website.

It has been circulated fairly widely so as to raise awareness amongst as many institutions and stakeholders as possible.

EUR-ACTIV action

In the same vein, EurActiv was commissioned to launch a new campaign to promote ACA-Europe, with a special focus on the information available on the website and the new logo. This campaign ran for five weeks between 28 February 2010 and 3 April 2011.

During the campaign, the following web banners were displayed on EurActiv's homepage (<http://www.euractiv.com>), as well as on the pages devoted to the priorities of the European Union and the institutions:



The links were also included in the newsletters that EurActiv sends regularly to its subscribers.

These web pages registered 162,903 hits over the five-week period.

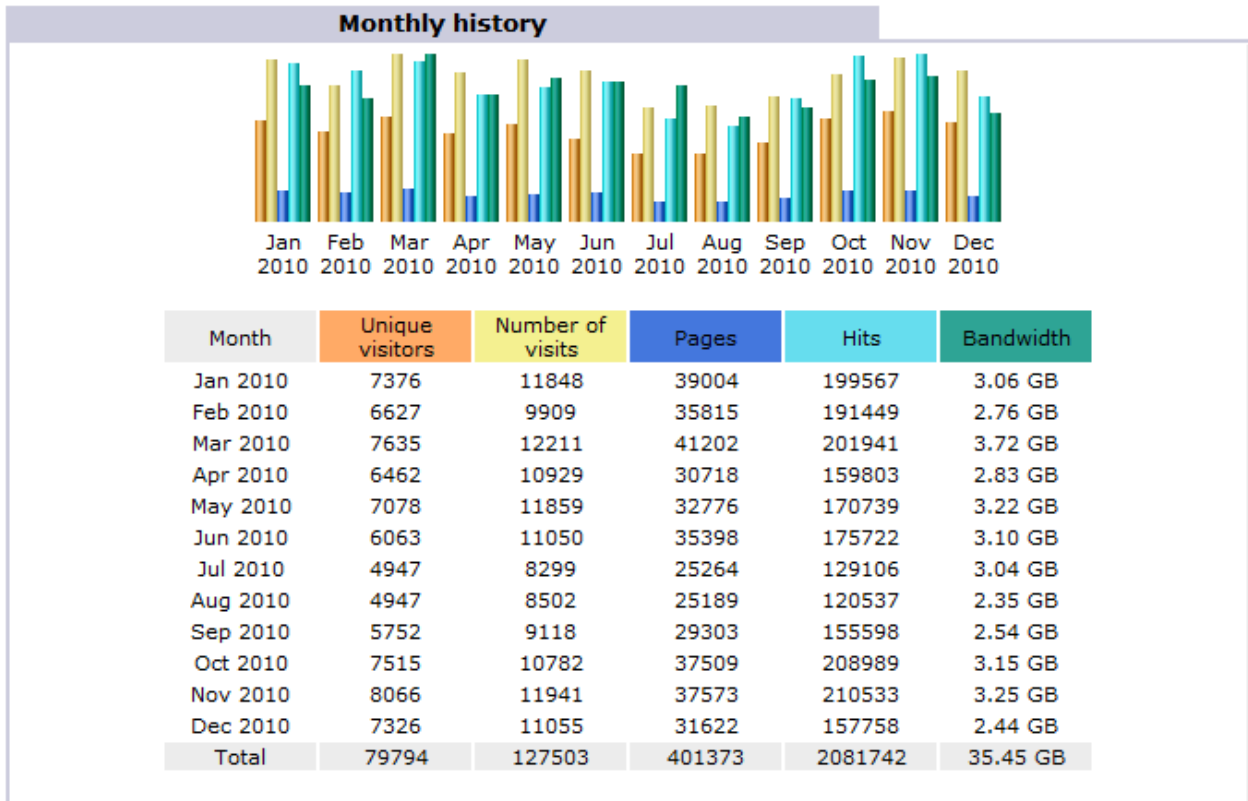

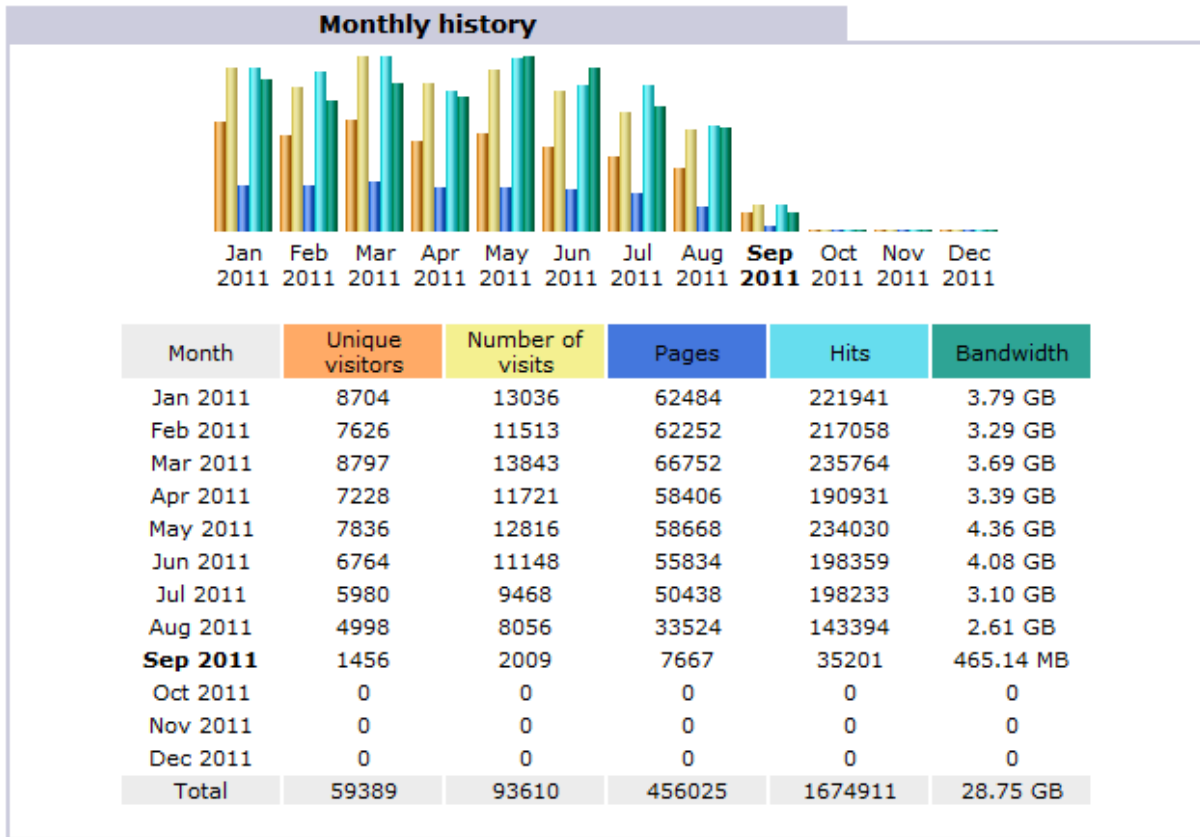

At the end of March 2008, the Network also sent its members an e-mail informing them of the possibility of entering decisions directly into JuriFast.

To date, only the Supreme Administrative Court of the Czech Republic has made use of this facility.

An agreement has been reached with ACA-Europe on integrating the search engines of those Councils of State and supreme administrative courts not belonging to the Network into the portal. Initially, the Councils of State of Belgium, Greece and Italy have been involved together with the Supreme Administrative Courts of the Czech Republic, Austria, Poland and Portugal.

The Councils of State of Belgium and the Netherlands have so far been integrated into the portal. However, it has not been technically possible to integrate the Supreme Administrative Court of Poland. Steps are currently being taken to integrate the Supreme Administrative Court of the Czech Republic.
